People being treated for type 2 diabetes are at great risk for overtreatment, due to a desire to prevent hyperglycemia and diabetes complications. Iatrogenic hypoglycemia, along with serious consequences such as impaired cognition, falls, fractures, motor vehicle accidents and seizures are common reasons for ER admissions, but can be prevented with shared decision making and appropriate deprescribing.
